**Standard Pistol:** Fired at 25 yards on 25 meter reduced (B-19) targets. Four 5 -shot series. Slow Fire 2 ½ minutes per series; Four 5 - shot series, 20 seconds per series; Four 5 - shot Series in 10 seconds each.

**Center Fire Pistol**: Fired at 25 yards on 25 meter reduced (B-19) targets and (B-38) targets. 30 shots slow fire on B19 target and 30 shots Rapid Fire on (B-38) target. Precision Fire; 5 shots in 5 minutes, Rapid Fire sequence is 7 seconds edged, 3 seconds faced.

**Air Pistol:** Fired at 10 meters on the B-40 target, 1 shot per target. Unlimited sighters and 60 shots for record, Time limit 1 hour and forty five minutes, including sighters.

#### Categories / Classes:

For the Service Pistol Championship ONLY: Competitors will be divided into two categories: (1) Civilian, and (2) Service. The Service Category will include Regular, Reserve, National Guard, and Police. With fewer than 5 competitors in a category, the categories will be combined within the same class. With fewer than 5 competitors in a combined class, the competitors will be moved to the next higher class (except Master to High Master). Each match will have an individual Match Winner. In each class and

category with 5-8 competitors, excluding a Match Winner, there will be a first place in class winner. With 9-15 competitors, a second place in class will be awarded. Match winners will not be eligible for any class award in the same match. In such cases, the class award will be passed on to the next ranking eligible score. A competitor will not be eligible for more than one award per match. In the event of at least 2 but fewer than 5 Master or High Master shooters, a winner or first in class will be paid, with only one Master or High Master shooter, match winner only will be paid.

For the Service Pistol Championship: Awards for all matches will be cash awards In addition, the winner of Match 5 will be declared the Arizona State Service Pistol Champion and will receive a Service Pistol Champion Trophy or Cash.

Categories / Classes: The NRA Classification system will be used. Separate class awards will be given in each of the (3) Categories: Civilian, Service, and Police. Members of the active Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, Air Force, and National Guard and Reserve components will Make up the Service Category. Members of Federal, State, County, Municipal law enforcement groups and Industrial Police comprise the Police Category. All others will be considered Civilians (Rule 2.2).

- 1. If there are less than five entries in any category within a class, they will be combined with other entries in another category within the same class.
- 2. If there are less than five entries after combining all categories of a class, there will be NO AWARDS provided in that class and all competitors in the lower class will be moved to their respective category in the next higher class.
- 3. If the five-competitor minimum required for award purposes has still not been fulfilled, competitors will be moved up in class and category until there are five or more in a class and category.
- 4. A class or category will not be combined downward. If there are less than five High Masters, they will compete for MATCH WINNER only.

Cash awards will be issued to shooters for matches and aggregate matches by class and category.

# Service Pistol and .22 Excellence in Competition Matches CMP Sanctioned Matches

The CMP Service Pistol EIC Match and .22 Rimfire EIC Match are sponsored by the Phoenix Rod and Gun Club, Pistol Division

**Eligibility:** Open to all eligible participants. You need not be a member of the NRA or a CMP affiliated club to participate.

#### Time, Date & Match Fees:

Matches will be held on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, February 13, 14 and 15, 2010 beginning at 1:30 PM.

Fees are \$15 per match and \$8 per match for Collegiates / Juniors.

**Course of Fire:** For Service Pistol EIC and CMP .22 Rim Fire EIC Pistol - the 30 shot National Match Course of Fire, 50/25 yds.

**Firearm:** "Service Pistol," ".22 Rimfire Pistol" as defined in the Current Edition of the CMP rules.

**Entries:** List the number of entries accepted or make note, there must be at least six non-distinguished shooters. Non-Distinguished shooters will get priority.

**Awards:** Gold, Silver & Bronze Achievement Pins will be presented to competitors (Distinguished or Non-Distinguished) in CMP-Sanctioned EIC Matches that equal or exceed Achievement Award Scores. **Points** – Points are given to any non-distinguished shooters who place in the top ten percent of non-distinguished shooters, provided that the score fired by the competitor equals or exceeds the EIC Minimum Credit Score. All Points are issued by the CMP.

**Minimum EIC Scores** – To receive EIC credit points, the score fired by the competitor must fulfill the requirements of Rule 9.2.6 (top 10%) and equal or exceed the EIC Minimum Credit Score (MCS) for that discipline. MCS scores are:

- Service Pistol, 250 of 300
- .22 Rimfire Pistol, 260 of 300

**Rules:** All EIC matches will be conducted in accordance with the current edition of the CMP Competition Rules for Service Rifle and Pistol, 20<sup>th</sup> Edition – 2016.
